Grade for Wolfee Donuts in Lake Elsinore reduced following food inspection

On July 7, the Riverside County Department of Environmental Health received a complaint about possible violations of the California Retail Food Code at Wolfee Donuts, 29997 Canyon Hills Road in Lake Elsinore. An accompanying video showed trays of donuts sitting on top of a display case while customers were inside the facility. Some customers were observed on the video licking the donuts.

An investigation and inspection of the establishment were completed on July 8. This inspection revealed various violations that resulted in the facility receiving a score of 86, which means the facility did not pass the inspection and consequently had insufficient points to receive an “A” grade. The grade for the shop was set at “B.” Following standard practices, the shop will have one week to make corrections, at which time the facility will be re-inspected. Operators of the facility may request an earlier re-inspection if violations are corrected sooner and may remain open for business under the current score.

The Riverside County Department of Environmental Health only has jurisdiction over health and operational issues involving food establishments in Riverside County. Any questions about potential criminal violations should be directed to the Riverside County Sheriff’s Department.
