Description of Incident	<p>Riverside County Environmental Health Hazmat (DEH) was contacted by Corona City Fire Hazmat regarding an incident at Leslie's Pool supply at the above location. DEH Hazmat personnel contacted Battalion Chief Wilson and was informed that there was a 1-gallon release of muriatic acid and 2 employees were exposed to vapors from the spilled acid and transported to Corona Regional Hospital experiencing respiratory irritation. DEH Hazmat personnel then contacted facility manager and confirmed that the spilled material would be cleaned up by Corona City Fire and that the disposal would be handled by the facility through an approved waste hauler.</p> <p>Manager was also advised to call in an OES report (21-3501).</p>

Health Recommendation	Immediately relocate to fresh air. Immediately rinse any affected areas with copious amounts of water. If breathing is difficult, provide oxygen. Do NOT use mouth-to-mouth resuscitation—use artificial respiration). If ingested, give 2-4 cups of milk or water, only if alert and oriented. Entry into affected area should be made only in proper personal protective equipment until incident is mitigated. Remove/contain source of release by qualified personnel.				
Description of Initial Mitigation Measures (evacuation, berming, absorption, containerizing)	Once Corona Fire (E99) was on scene and all victims were assessed, the air was monitored for any hazards and the spill was contained and mitigated by Corona fire.				
Cleanup Status	Chemical residuals were mitigated by Corona City Fire Hazmat and the facility will be handling the disposal of the waste through an approved hazardous waste hauler.
